## Minutes of the Adlington Annual Town Meeting held on Monday 13 May 2019 In Adlington Library, Railway Road Adlington commencing at 7:15pm

Mr Turner explained that sales of poppies are the main source of income for the RBL and that last year just over £1Million was raised in Lancashire and £44Million nationally. The theme for 2019 will be "Remember Together" acknowledging the importance of all of the Commonwealth nations working together.
